SPECIAL NEEDS TRANSPORTATION

The following services require an intake and determination of eligibility before services can be provided.

- ❖ AGING SERVICES, INC., (724) 349-4500 or (800) 442-8016, arranges transportation for individuals 60 years of age and older to social centers, medical appointments, grocery shopping and other essential business with prior approval. A small fare is charged.
- ❖ AMERICAN CANCER SOCIETY, (800) 227-2345, The Road to Recovery Program provides free ground transportation to and from cancer-related medical appointments for people with cancer who do not have a ride or are unable to drive themselves. Depending on each individual's needs and what's available in their area, they may be able to coordinate a ride with an ACS volunteer driver Patients must call in advance to register and to make travel arrangements.
- ❖ CITIZENS' TRANSPORT SERVICE, (724) 349-5527 provides wheelchair vans and ambulatory rides for non-emergency, medical appointments (no stretchers). Call M-F, 7:00 am-6:00 pm at number above to make a reservation.
- **COMMUNITY CARE MANAGEMENT**, (814) 534-3032 or 1-866-429-1583, provides mileage reimbursement for medical and social service appointments for people living with HIV/AIDS and meet the qualifications. Their service area is Indiana, Cambria, Somerset, and Westmoreland Counties.





- ❖ INDIANA COUNTY ASSISTANCE OFFICE, (724) 357-2900 or (800) 742-0679, may provide reimbursement of: medical transportation costs to individuals receiving medical assistance, transportation costs to individuals receiving cash or food stamps for specific job search activities. Reimbursements require prior approval.
- ❖ INDIGO / PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES PROGRAM, (724) 465-2140 or (800) 442-6928, provides transportation for those between the ages of 18 to 64, live in Indiana County, and have a disability defined by the Americans with Disability Act. The PwD Program helps people get to appointments, shopping, jobs, and recreational activities. For more information, costs, and an application, call IndiGO or visit www.indigobus.com
- ❖ Indiana County Veterans Office, (724) 465-3815, offers free transportation for Veterans with medical appointments at VA Medical Centers and outpatient clinics. Transportation is available to the Indiana, Altoona, Butler, University Drive and Aspinwall in Pittsburgh, as well as Greensburg, DuBois, Kittanning, and Johnstown. The service uses Disabled American Veterans (DAV) vans driven by volunteers. Veterans must schedule transportation at least two weeks in advance. Please note, the vans are not handicap accessible and cannot accommodate wheelchairs or motorized scooters.



❖ HEALTH RIDE PLUS, 814-948-6510 or 1-888-661-7587, or www.healthrideplus.com offers non-emergency para-transit service for clients in need of transportation for medical appointments. They also provide transportation for recreation, social and other purposes. Call for fees, some may be insurance billable. Services are available 24 hours per day/7 days per week.



❖ MED-VAN, (814) 948-6170 or (888) 633-9995, or www.med-van.com provides wheelchair/stretcher and automobile transportation to medical or non-emergency appointments across the state. Call for fees, some may be insurance billable. Intakes can be completed over the telephone. Services are available 24 hours per day, 7 days a week.

When a dialysis patient needs help with transportation costs to and from dialysis treatment, the Chronic Renal Disease Program (CRDP) may offer reimbursement to assist with these costs.

About the Program: As a participating Provider for the PA Department of Health Chronic Renal Disease Program (CRDP) Transportation Program, the National Kidney Foundation administers reimbursement for public, shared-ride, invalid coach and non-emergency transportation expenses incurred by qualified dialysis patients in our region.

Who Qualifies: You must be an active member of the CRDP Program before you apply for transportation benefits. Please reach out to your dialysis clinic social worker to see if you're eligible and help assist you with completing the transportation application.

❖ OFFICE OF VOCATIONAL REHABILITATION (OVR), (800) 762-4223, OVR can assist eligible Indiana County clients who have a disability with transportation costs in cases where a hardship may exist.
